Nov. 11 commemorates the day fighting ceased in 1918 during World War I. Memorial gestures, dating back to 1921, took place all over the world to honor fallen soldiers who were being buried in each nation's highest place of honor. The memorial gestures all took place on Nov. 11, giving universal recognition to the celebrated ending of World War I fighting at 11 a.m. (the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month). This Day became known as "Armistice Day."

The first celebration using the term "Veterans Day" occurred in 1947 in Birmingham, Alabama. World War II Veteran Raymond Weeks organized "National Veterans Day" on Nov. 11, which included a parade and other festivities, honoring all veterans. U.S. Rep. Edward Rees of Kansas proposed a bill that would change Armistice Day to Veterans Day. In 1954, Congress passed the bill that President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed proclaiming Nov. 11 as Veterans Day, a day to honor American Veterans of all wars.
