HIS PARENTS BROUGHT THEIR FAMILY TO THE U.S. FROM SOUTH KOREA WHEN CHOI WAS NINE YEARS OLD AND HE GREW UP IN AKRON, OHIO AND CHICAGO. CHOI CAME TO MISSOURI IN 2017 AFTER NINE YEARS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT WHERE HE SERVED AS PROVOST AND EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT (2012-2017) AND EARLIER AS DEAN OF ENGINEERING (2008-2012). HE EARNED HIS BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN GENERAL ENGINEERING FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS-URBANA CHAMPAIGN AND HIS M.A. AND PH.D. DEGREES IN MECHANICAL AND AEROSPACE ENGINEERING FROM PRINCETON UNIVERSITY.
