1970

The first march for gay rights occurred June 28, 1970 In New York City. It was a great success with an estimated 3,000 to 5,000 participants. Marches were also held in Los Angeles and San Francisco.

1983

Rep. Gerry Studds from Massachusettes becomes the first openly gay member of congress.



1996

The Supreme Court rules protection from discrimination is a civil right guaranteed to all U.S. Citizens, including those in the LGBTQIA+ community.

2000

Vermont is the first state to legally acknowledge civil unions for gay couples. President Bill Clinton declares June Gay and Lesbian Pride Month.

2004

Same-sex marriage laws are passed in Massachusetts for the first time in U.S. history.



The Supreme Court of the United States of America Rules in favor of same-sex marriage.
